Historical Note

In 2008, the AIDS Healthcare Foundation initiated regular activities in Europe, starting partnerships with government and NGOs in Ukraine, Russia, Estonia, and Lithuania. The formal establishment of the European Bureau at AHF began in 2010. The Ukraine, Russia, and Estonia programs focus on prevention and rapid testing, clinical and quality improvement, and advocacy and marketing. The European Union and new countries program is also essential to the AHF European Bureau. The countries include Lithuania, Greece, Portugal, Netherlands, the United Kingdom, and Georgia. Region-wide and global activities focus on conferences and publications and global advocacy action.

In 2013, AHF was formally registered in Ukraine, Russia, and Estonia. By 2017 there were 50,000 patients in care in the European Bureau, and in 2018 reached the milestone of 1 Million rapid HIV tests in Europe Bureau. There are currently 10 countries in the European Bureau, including Estonia, Georgia, Greece, Lithuania, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Ukraine, and the United Kingdom.
